Family History, Public Racing Profile, Affiliations, and Documented Context

A public-source research brief

Purpose and scope. This report compiles public racing records, ministry media, public family-history material, and publicly visible promotional content concerning Cameron Hagin. It separates confirmed facts from unverified claims and identifies subjects for which the reviewed public record does not provide reliable proof. It does not infer misconduct, employment, financial benefit, ownership, political activity, or responsibility from family relationship, sponsor text, photographs, or social-media contact alone.

Executive summary

Cameron Hagin is publicly identified as a Broken Arrow, Oklahoma racing competitor and as the oldest son of Craig W. Hagin and Melissa Lynn Robertson, publicly known in some ministry materials as Melissa/Missy Hagin and later Melissa/Missy Hagin-Pittman. He is a great-grandson of Kenneth E. Hagin and Oretha Rooker Hagin. The strongest independent record concerns his sustained participation in Oklahoma and regional sprint-car/midget racing, including United Sprint League (USL), American Sprint Car Series (ASCS) coverage, the Chili Bowl Nationals, and the Tulsa Shootout. Public material identifies him in racing-team and sponsor contexts, including historic entries listing Rhema Bible Church among sponsors and a 2018 USL profile that listed Kenneth Hagin as car owner. These sources document event participation and stated entry/team context; they do not establish audited funding, a personal income level, ownership percentage, or church approval process.

The reviewed public record does not establish a verified personal salary, net worth, bank relationship, business ownership percentage, paid-influencer agreement, political role, campaign affiliation, formal ministry office, or education credential. A targeted review also did not locate a reliable public source confirming that Cameron Hagin is or was employed by Rhema in maintenance. This is a negative research result, not proof that he has never performed paid or volunteer work for Rhema.

Siblings	Blake Hagin and Skylar Hagin	Public family timeline material identifies Blake and Skylar as siblings. Their individual conduct, legal history, or employment must not be attributed to Cameron.
Public identity	Cameron Hagin of Broken Arrow, Oklahoma	USL, ASCS, and Chili Bowl materials identify a Cameron Hagin competing from Broken Arrow, Oklahoma.

Family history and relationship map

Birth and early household. Project timeline material records Cameron Hagin's birth as April 28, 1994, and identifies Craig W. Hagin and Melissa Lynn Robertson (Melissa/Missy Hagin, later Hagin-Pittman) as his parents. A 2025 public birthday post by Craig Hagin independently describes Cameron as Craig's oldest son and gives the same date. Cameron is a great-grandson of Kenneth E. Hagin and Oretha Rooker Hagin. He was born into an established family ministry environment in the Tulsa/Broken Arrow area. That history supplies public context; it is not proof of a personal ministry position, compensation arrangement, or decision-making authority.

What the record does not establish. The review does not establish a complete verified family tree, a current spouse/partner identity, residence address, private employers, private financial accounts, personal property inventory, or every family-connected organization. The report does not publish private contact information, addresses, or unverified personal details.

2025	USL coverage identifies him as active in the points race; Hagin Racing public content reports a fourth-place season-points finish.
2026	Chili Bowl official entry pages list Cameron Hagin in Broken Arrow, including an entry associated with A.J. Felker Racing/FSC/Esslinger. Public Hagin Racing material describes a 2026 #5 sprint-car program.

Education and professional development

Education verification. No reliable person-specific source reviewed confirms Cameron Hagin's high school, college enrollment, degree, trade credential, professional license, or graduation. A LinkedIn result for a different Cameron Hagin in Austin, Texas was excluded because identity could not be safely matched. The defensible wording is: "No verified formal education history located in reviewed public sources."

Racing education and technical participation. Public material reflects long-term involvement in racing competition and race-team preparation. That supports a conclusion of sustained practical participation in the sport, but it does not establish a trade license, professional certification, paid employment by a racing business, or ownership of equipment.

Racing history, team context, and affiliations

The strongest documentary record concerns racing. USL and ASCS materials identify Cameron Hagin in results, point standings, driver profiles, and regional events. The 2018 USL profile described him as a #5 competitor and named Kenneth Hagin as car owner. The current public-facing Hagin Racing profile identifies Cameron as driver, while Craig Hagin's public LinkedIn profile describes Hagin Racing and identifies Cameron as its driver. These are representations of team/driver context, not audited corporate records.

Publicly documented racing organizations and events

- United Sprint League (USL): 2018 driver spotlight; later points and event materials identify Cameron Hagin of Broken Arrow, including 2022 championship context and 2025 point-race coverage.
- American Sprint Car Series (ASCS): official reports list Cameron Hagin in Sooner and regional sprint-car competition, including a 2021 New Tulsa Speedway report.
- Chili Bowl Nationals and Tulsa Shootout: official entry pages place Cameron Hagin in public midget-racing event contexts, with varying team/owner/sponsor text across entries.
- Hagin Racing: the team's public Facebook page describes a driver context for Cameron Hagin. Social posts are used here as corroborating public promotional content, not a corporate registry or financial statement.
- A.J. Felker Racing / FSC chassis context: a 2026 Chili Bowl entry lists Cameron Hagin with A.J. Felker Racing, FSC, Esslinger, and named sponsor/owner text. This shows an entry relationship for that event; it does not prove a broader business partnership or equity interest.

Sponsor, vendor, and social-network references

Historic Chili Bowl entry text for Cameron Hagin lists Fenton, Boss, Esslinger, 4-Wheel Parts, Rhema Bible Church, Marc Crocker Insurance, and Southside Mowers. Separately, a 2026 entry lists A.J. Felker Racing, FSC, Esslinger, and Trans Union. Sponsorship lines may represent cash sponsorship, donated products/services, team marketing arrangements, chassis/engine/vendor relationships, or owner information. They do not independently establish payment amounts, a written agreement, tax treatment, donor restrictions, or use of nonprofit funds.

Publicly visible social and promotional connection is not the same as a verified "influencer" relationship. No reviewed source identified a talent agency, media kit, rate card, paid ambassador agreement, quantified social-media revenue, or endorsement contract. The appropriate description is "public racing promotion and sponsor recognition," not "verified paid influencer."

Rhema connection and reported maintenance role

Confirmed public connection. A 2021 Rhema Bible Church podcast episode featured Cameron Hagin in a family-oriented episode. A historic Chili Bowl sponsor line for one entry includes Rhema Bible Church. These facts establish a visible connection to the church/ministry environment and a historic sponsor-text reference. They do not establish employment, maintenance duties, compensation, ordination, officer status, board role, or authorization to represent Rhema.

Maintenance employment claim. No reliable public source located in this review confirms that Cameron Hagin works or worked for Rhema in maintenance. Searches of publicly indexed Rhema pages, widely surfaced search results, racing/media coverage, and public-facing social/profile results did not yield an official staff bio, maintenance/facilities listing, employment announcement, or job-title reference. The fact that race-team posts use the word "maintenance" for race-car work does not support a claim about a Rhema maintenance job.

Publicly defensible website wording: "A reported Rhema maintenance employment connection has not been verified by a reliable public source reviewed as of June 23, 2026. Confirmation would require an official staff listing, a direct statement, lawfully available employment/payroll documentation, a court filing, or reliable contemporaneous reporting."

Financial context, personal net-worth, and organizational-interest limits

No probate record, personal financial statement, tax return, compensation report, asset disclosure, salary record, property inventory, bank record, brokerage record, trust document, or court-filed financial affidavit was located in this review that verifies Cameron Hagin's personal income, net worth, debts, assets, banking relationship, credit history, or ownership percentage in Hagin Racing or any entity. Banking information is normally private and must not be guessed from social media, sponsor decals, family connections, or event participation.

The record supports identifying public racing activity and sponsor/team text. It does not establish whether racing expenses were paid personally, by a team, by a family member, by a business, through in-kind support, or by any charitable or ministry entity. A claim that church or ministry funds supported racing would require direct transactional evidence: for example, an invoice, payment record, board minutes, documented sponsorship agreement, conflict-of-interest disclosure, donor restriction, tax filing, or reliable investigative reporting naming the transaction and funding entity.

Net-worth notation. No credible third-party net-worth estimate specifically attributable to Cameron Hagin was located. The appropriate classification is "not verified / no reliable estimate located," rather than a numerical claim.

Politics, memberships, travel, and public-service record

No reviewed reliable public source identifies Cameron Hagin as a political candidate, officeholder, campaign employee, political committee officer, lobbyist, publicly disclosed donor, or registered political organization representative. Family, church, or community political networks cannot establish an individual political affiliation or role.

The supported affiliations in the reviewed material are racing/event affiliations: USL competition, ASCS-related events, Chili Bowl Nationals, Tulsa Shootout, local tracks, Hagin Racing branding/team context, and a documented Rhema podcast appearance. These are not necessarily legal memberships, employment relationships, directorships, board appointments, or governance positions.

Public sources show regional and event-related travel associated with racing, including Oklahoma and race-event activity. They do not establish international ministry travel, travel reimbursement from a nonprofit or ministry, official delegation status, or a personal travel budget. A 2026 floating search result about a different "Cameron Hagin" at UT Austin was not used because the identity could not be confirmed.

Credibility indicators, caution rules, and what was not located

Established public indicators

- Long-term, independently documented participation in regional dirt-track, sprint-car, and midget-racing events.
- Public team/driver references in USL, ASCS, Chili Bowl, Hagin Racing, and related event materials.
- Publicly visible connection to a multigenerational Tulsa-area ministry family - including great-grandparents Kenneth E. and Oretha Hagin - and a documented 2021 Rhema podcast appearance.
- Current public racing activity reflected in 2025-2026 standings and event-entry materials.

What the review did not locate

- A verified salary, W-2/1099 compensation, employment contract, net-worth estimate, personal bank relationship, credit information, asset list, or personal tax record.
- An official Rhema staff listing or reliable source confirming a maintenance/facilities job.
- A verified college degree, trade credential, or professional-license history attributable to this Cameron Hagin.
- A reliable public source identifying him as a political candidate, officeholder, campaign staffer, political committee officer, lobbyist, or disclosed donor.
- A reliable public source establishing an arrest, criminal conviction, professional-licensing discipline, government enforcement action, or civil judgment against him personally. This limited search result is not a full criminal-background certification.
- A verified paid-influencer agreement, sponsorship dollar amount, nonprofit/military/church payment, or ownership percentage in any racing entity.

Records that would resolve open questions

- Official Rhema staff directory, facilities/maintenance department record, job posting, employment announcement, direct written confirmation, or lawfully available employment/payroll documentation to confirm or disprove a maintenance role.
- Oklahoma Secretary of State entity records, trade-name registrations, annual certificates, registered-agent filings, and contracts for Hagin Racing or related entities.

- Racing-team records: vehicle/trailer/engine titles, insurance certificates, sponsorship agreements, invoices, payment records, and ownership documents.
- Rhema or related nonprofit board minutes, sponsorship policies, conflict-of-interest disclosures, and payment approvals if organizational funding of a racing activity is alleged.
- Campaign-finance records or direct contribution disclosures if a political contribution, committee role, lobbying activity, or campaign relationship is alleged.
- Authorized education verification or a direct public statement from the individual for school/degree claims.

Core sources reviewed

Official and primary-event sources are prioritized. Public social posts are used only as corroborating lead sources and event-promotion evidence, not as conclusive proof of finances, employment, ownership, or legal status.
